



MANITOBA ARTS AND CULTURAL MANAGEMENT CERTIFICATE

Part-Time Program

The Manitoba Arts and Cultural Management Certificate Program is available to individuals currently working in, or trying to break into, Canada's arts and cultural sector. This program is designed to build the business and leadership skills necessary to manage and nurture creative activity in stable cultural organizations.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS:

Required Courses: (183 Hours)**

- Learning Techniques Seminar (3 Hours)
- Effective Oral Communication (36 Hours)
- Effective Written Communication (36 Hours)
- Introduction to Arts and Cultural Management (36 Hours)
- Policy and Leadership in the Canadian Cultural Sector (36 Hours)
- Managing and Governance in Arts and Culture Organizations (36 Hours)

Elective Courses: (72 hours)

Choose two courses from the following list:

- Financial Management for Non-Financial Managers (36 Hours)
- Managing Conflict (36 Hours)
- Introduction to Production for Film (36 Hours)

Professional Edge Seminars (35 hours total):

Complete five one-day seminars (7 hours each) or a combination of one and two-day seminars (14 hours) for a total of 35 hours. The following seminars are highly recommended for MACMP students:

- Effective Grant Proposal Writing
- Managing Projects for Better Results
- Mastering Reports and Proposals

Students who do not hold an undergraduate degree must complete the University Writing and Research seminar as one of their Professional Edge seminar requirements if they are pursuing a certificate and diploma program through the Professional Studies Program Area.
